Welcome to Fleming

The Town of Fleming is governed by a Mayor and six member Council. Open town meetings are held on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall. To see a calendar of our community activities go to our website, www.neco-land.com

Business hours for the Town Hall are Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Utilities are furnished to our residents by the Town, which operates electric distribution, water and wastewater.

Kinder Morgan with a regional office in Scottsbluff, Nebraska supplies natural gas.

Telephone service is provided by Haxtun Telephone Company with an office in Haxtun.

Trash hauling service is available from Marick's Waste Disposal in Crook, or Waste Management in Sterling.

The Cable T.V. services provider is PC Telecom out of Holyoke, CO.

Meters for the town-supplied utilities are read on the 15th of each month. Bills are due by the 5th of each month. Bills are not mailed out unless so requested by the customer, and then a \$.50 charge is added.

The Town does regulate building and zoning through its ordinances, so if you plan to build, remodel, start a business, etc., please check with the Town Clerk.

We encourage you to use a trash dumpster. The Town does not allow burning within town limits, unless a permit is obtained through the Town Hall. Basically this permit will allow you to burn tumbleweeds when weather permits.

The Town does enforce animal control ordinances. We have identification tag requirements for dogs and cats and a leash requirement for dogs. The Town conducts a vaccination day for pets each year. Pet owners are required to have their pets vaccinated or show proof of vaccination to receive a pet I.D. tag. Dogs running at large are subject to impoundment. There is a limit of three dogs and three cats per household.

During the summer months (May - September), the Town asks for community support in enforcing watering restrictions. No watering of lawns or using open-end hoses from 1:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. daily (except Sundays & holidays, when watering is allowed all day, and except children running through the water sprinkler). This program not only encourages water conservation, but helps keep our electricity demand down.

The Town maintains a cemetery northwest of Fleming, and two Town parks. The North Park includes tennis courts, half-court basketball facilities, restrooms, and playground equipment. Heritage Museum Park includes two museum buildings, playground equipment, picnic shelters, RV parking with dump station, restrooms, and information stand.

A curfew for children under 18 years has been adopted between the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Parents and guardians are responsible for curfew violations.

Fleming History

In 1887, the railroad was being built from Holdredge, Nebraska, to Sterling, Colorado, and it had reached what was then known as 29 mile siding. Several spurs or sidings were established for the settlers, who were seeking homesteads, to side their emigrant cars until they could locate a site and construct a soddie or dugout in which to live. The rail superintendent of the railroad was a man named Calvert, and since any mail to this spot was in care of him, the siding became Calvert.

Mr. Calvert had a brother-in-law sent out here by the Lincoln Land Co. to sell land to settlers. The man's name was Henry Bascom Fleming, and the land company gave him 240 acres one mile west of the siding. The following year, Mr. Fleming gave this land for a town site, and it was named for him. All businesses at Calvert were moved to the Town of Fleming. The town was incorporated in 1917.

Fleming has a population of approximately 475; however, its schools and churches encompass many farms and ranches.

In its early days, Fleming was a very prosperous town, serving the town and outlying communities with a lumber yard, two banks, two movie houses, barber shop, attorney's office, general store, telephone company, newspaper and service stations.

Currently, we have a downtown area that offers essential goods and services to our community.



Quality of Life

Fleming is a clean, attractive and pleasant small town. The water and air are pure and healthy. The residents are caring and neighborly. If you want to get involved - look out! We have much to offer. Let me tell you about some of our social and civic organizations.

Fleming Volunteer Fire Department is a volunteer organization for fire, rescue and medical emergencies. The Fleming Fire Protection District covers approximately 260 square miles in Northeastern Logan County. The Fire Protection District has 6 units for emergency services, including fire-fighting and medical emergency equipment. The firemen meet once a month on the third Wednesday. Here are a few things you should know about our fire whistle:

- Meeting Night: The fire whistle will go off on the third Wednesday of each month to signify that there is a meeting that night.
- Fire or Medical Emergency: The whistle also goes off to signify a fire or medical emergency. Please let the responders have the right of way.
- Tornado: In the event of a tornado, the whistle will be different from the meeting or the emergency whistle. This one will be one steady whistle. This means take cover for a tornado emergency.

Fleming Community Pride is here to enhance the quality of life in the Fleming Community by providing financial support; coordinating; and volunteering of time; to promote civic, cultural, spiritual, educational, and charitable projects and programs.

Living at Home Program is a volunteer based program whose goal is to assist area senior citizens so that they will be able to continue living in their own homes.

Fleming Community Library is open to everyone. This facility is located at the school and includes a separate entrance for non-students. This combined school and public library fits the needs of every user of the community.

Fleming Community Preschool provides a high quality, early childhood educational program based on developmentally appropriate practices, which facilitate the growth of children - socially, emotionally, physically and cognitively.

The preschool calendar coincides with the school district calendar with classes Tuesday through Friday. More information about the preschool is available from the school district.

Preschool Story Hour During the school year, the Fleming Library Association sponsors a weekly story hour for children ages 3 to 5 years old. This Story Hour program is held at the Fleming Community Library. For more information, call 265-2046.

Social and Study Clubs Several clubs serve the area by offering a chance to learn and socialize. They include 20-20 Club, New Horizons Club, Tri-L C Club. We also have a Historical Society trying to preserve the history of the area, and the various churches in the area sponsor clubs and youth groups. 4-H and church sponsored youth groups are also available to interested young people.

Fleming V.F.W. Fleming has a very active community oriented VFW.

Special Events take place throughout the year in the Fleming Community and several on an annual basis. These special events are sponsored by the various clubs and organizations. Annual special events include:

- Easter Egg Hunt
- July 4th Bar-b-Que and Fireworks
- Fleming Fall Festival –includes parade, games, booths, exhibits, dinner and homecoming football game and volleyball games.
- VFW Halloween Party for Elementary and Jr. High age - includes costume and pumpkin carving contest and treats.
- VFW Christmas Party for the youngsters.
- Christmas Festival of Lights—includes craft fair, parade of homes, chili contest, visit from Santa, children’s activities, horse-drawn wagon rides, caroling, and tree-lighting.

Advisory Boards

Appointed by the Town Council

Planning and Zoning: Five (5) member committee made up of town residents to review building permits, make recommendations on planning and zoning issues and enforce compliance of planning and zoning ordinances.

Cemetery: Several community members make up this committee that oversee maintenance and improvements of the town cemetery. Recent projects include new inurnment area, Armed Services Memorial and fencing and landscape improvements.

Parks: Members of this committee volunteer to plant and maintain several flower beds downtown and in the parks as well as make recommendations for improvements to town parks.

Recreation: This active committee also oversees the following subcommittees, Activities, Concession, Health/Safety and Sports. Recent projects include special seasonal events such as Christmas celebration, craft fairs, etc.; coordinating summer recreation activities such as ball programs, summer reading, swimming and golf.; developing a community readiness program in case of disaster.

School District

Welcome to the Town of Fleming and welcome to the Fleming School District. You will find that our school district is current with changing technology and offers a variety of activities for our students. We have exceptional teachers and we are always looking for new programs to incorporate for our students.

Fleming School District consists of grades PreK-12. We have a four-day school week, attending school Tuesday through Friday, 8:00 a.m.-3:46 p.m. Buses will pick-up and take home students who live within the school district.

We have several sports in which students can take part: Basketball, Volleyball, Football, Track, Wrestling, and Baseball. We also have a 5th and 6th grade band which students may elect to attend every day as well as grades 7-12 band which meet at scheduled times. The bands perform as a marching band when seasonally appropriate. There is also a high school choir. We have a music parents organization that allows parents to be involved by holding fund-raisers to help financially with camps, trips and other music events.

Our high school students broadcast the current news, weather and other information every morning.

Our school has a current and well-stocked library available for our students and this library is also made available to the public.

Advance placement is available for English and Math classes. We also have special needs classes and we are ADA accessible.

Two vocational classes are offered: Business and Agriculture. We have implemented a greenhouse program as part of the Ag program. This will allow the students to landscape a portion of the school grounds each year.

We have 3 computer labs which students have available for use. And here is a great option for parents: Your child's grades are available on-line for grades 7-12!

As you can see, Fleming School District has so much to offer your child. We are very proud of our school system and of course our students.
